

## **History of UUBN**

- **1859** The Free Congregational Society of the City of Bloomington was organized
- **1868** the first building was completed and stood in downtown Bloomington for 90 years
- **1885** our name officially changed to the Unitarian Church of Bloomington
- 1945 UUBN Trust established
- **1960** our present building was built, with the RE wing added in 1968
- **1965** Adlai Stevenson Memorial Service held at UUBN. Pres Johnson & VP Humphrey were in attendance
- **1997** UUBN recognized by the UUA as a *Welcoming Congregation*
- **2002** congregation voted to change name to Unitarian Universalist Church of Bloomington Normal.
- 2009 150th anniversary celebration
- **2012** new addition added a larger narthex, church office and classroom
- **2019** congregational vote to add *Black Lives Matter* to our sign and RE added more anti-racism education
- **2020** Rev. Rebecca Gant called to be our minister
- **2021** UUBN partnered with Prairie Pride Coalition to offer the Gender Expansive Resource Center
