# Rev. Gant on Civil Rights Sites Trip April 11-19

As I have mentioned to many of you, I'm participating in a trip to learn more about Civil Rights era history and to see the sites where many important events took place. This trip will be with clergy and congregants from a variety of congregations—Moses Montefiore, Normal First United Methodist, Mennonite Church Normal, as well as a scattering of folks from other Methodist, Presbyterian, and Episcopal congregations. Our members Bill Rau and Barb Heyl will also attend.

The 40+ people who will go on the trip have been meeting together for several months to learn more about the history and the sites we will visit. We've read The 1619 Project: A New Origin Story together and begun to get acquainted. It has been a great experience so far!

What does this mean for UUBN? I think you won't notice a huge difference. I will officially be on Study Leave, which means I will check email daily, but my responses to non-emergent issues will be delayed. I will still be available by phone or text if you have a need to reach me quickly, and I'll check in with staff periodically. Worship on the 14th will be in the capable hands of the Worship Team.

I'm sure you'll hear about our experience on the trip through the Parish News and in future sermons.

I'm so grateful to be in a position where I'm expected to continue to learn and grow-- and that that learning and growth is supported by professional development funds. Thank you for the opportunity!




# **Second Annual Transgender Resource Fair**

# Pink Haven Coalition & Our Response to Anti-LGBTQI Legislation

As many of you know, our trans and gender expansive Beloveds are under attack and being criminalized\* in many US states. This is so serious that they fit the criteria to be designated as internally displaced people (IDPs) by the United Nations. The Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) and Unitarian Universalist Service Committee (UUSC) are partnering directly with frontline trans-led organizing to create networks of safety and direct support for Beloveds who need to relocate, access healthcare across state lines, or stay as safe as possible where they are. Because of safety concerns for these trans organizers, we are prioritizing security over transparency right now, which is allowing us to move together in deep trust during these crucial, scary times. This network has come to be known as the Pink Haven Coalition. A small group of UUBNers met with Heather Vickery from UUSC to learn more about how we can get involved in supporting trans folks hoping to relocate to Bloomington-Normal or needing a place to land for a short time on their way to a new home community. Illinois is considered one of the most affordable safe states! UU of Peoria is already involved and the hope is that all Central Illinois UU churches will join in.

Have you ever wondered how you would have supported people whose rights were being violated in the past? Now is your chance to take action! Soon we will schedule a planning meeting that will be open to all. During that meeting, we will break into four planning groups (housing, fundraising, daily needs, and systems support) to start mapping out what resources and connections we can bring to this work and consider what next steps might be.

SB3499, The End-of-Life Options Act was recently introduced to the Illinois General Assembly. It authorizes a qualified patient with a terminal disease to request that a physician prescribe aid-in-dying medication that will allow the patient to end the patient's life in a peaceful manner.
