

Pink Haven Coalition & Our Response to Anti-LGBTQI Legislation

As many of you know, our trans and gender expansive Beloveds are under attack and being criminalized* in many US states. This is so serious that they fit the criteria to be designated as internally displaced people (IDPs) by the United Nations. The Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) and Unitarian Universalist Service Committee (UUSC) are partnering directly with frontline trans-led organizing to create networks of safety and direct support for Beloveds who need to relocate, access healthcare across state lines, or stay as safe as possible where they are. Because of safety concerns for these trans organizers, we are prioritizing security over transparency right now, which is allowing us to move together in deep trust during these crucial, scary times. This network has come to be known as the Pink Haven Coalition.

A small group of UUBNers met with Heather Vickery from UUSC to learn more about how we can get involved in supporting trans folks hoping to relocate to Bloomington-Normal or needing a place to land for a short time on their way to a new home community. **Illinois is considered one of the most affordable safe states!** UU of Peoria is already involved and the hope is that all Central Illinois UU churches will join in.

Have you ever wondered how you would have supported people whose rights were being violated in the past? Now is your chance to take action! Soon we will schedule a planning meeting that will be open to all. During that meeting, we will break into four planning groups (housing, fundraising, daily needs, and systems support) to start mapping out what resources and connections we can bring to this work and consider what next steps might be.
