Pledge Drive Progress

Religious Exploration

Note from Terina:

Last week I attended the Liberal Religious Educators Association's (LREDA) Fall Conference with a focus on collaboration with colleagues and rest as resistance. There were about 200 of us online and I met in person with the DREs from Peoria, Urbana, and Springfield. Many great things came out of this gathering. A couple things you might be excited to hear about are our new Bookshop account and our planned Rest as Resistance programming.

If you're ready to spend your book money somewhere other than Amazon, the church now has a virtual storefront on Bookshop: https://bookshop.org/shop/uubn Bookshop supports independent bookstores like Bobzbay in downtown Bloomington through online ordering and shipping to your home. I've started creating book lists for Common Reads, Time for All Ages, and each OWL group. If you purchase books through our virtual storefront, the church will receive a small percentage. Not all titles are available there but I'm finding that most are.

My Central Illinois colleagues and I are planning to offer Rest as Resistance sessions beginning in December. We'll to offer a monthly online session for the 4 congregations and I will offer a monthly in person session for our community. During these 45 minute gatherings, we'll hear a reading from *Rest as Resistance* by Tricia Hersey; we'll rest together; reflect on rest as resistance in a capitalist society, and leave with a "practice to resist grind culture" from Tricia Hersey's <u>Rest Deck</u>.

Next year's Common Read is *Social Change Now: A Guide for Reflection and Connection* from Deepa Iyer. Our Sunday Adult RE offering in January will be based on the work in this book. You can order and start reading now OR come ready to learn.

An intention for RE this year is a congregation wide conversation about the goals for Religious Exploration for all ages. Look for December dates and come ready to talk about your expectations, your needs, and your interests.

Another intention this year is consistent, ongoing training as additional support for RE teachers. Last Sunday, Trisha Malott, Clinical Social Worker and Director of Central Illinois

Bridge Academy (https://www.cibridge.org/contact), led a lunch and learn for RE teachers and Over the Rainbow facilitators. We learned how to be more welcoming to children and youth who are neurodiverse or have a trauma background. Thank you for participating Connor, Allison, Ryan, James, Blair, Cheryl, Joanne, Rae, Sawyer, Sara, Claire, Javi, Mary Ellen, Meghan, Mercy, and Adrienne!

Over the Rainbow & WGLT

Over the Rainbow is a community social group for queer kids that's sponsored by the church in partnership with PFLAG. Money for the group is provided by PFLAG while the church provides spaces and runs the background checks through our insurance (those are also paid by PFLAG). Blair volunteers her personal time as manager. And I'm the staff person who is the contact for the sponsorship (lots of work last summer, not so much now). 
