Updates from the Board of Directors

The Board would like to formally thank Dick Hanson for his 20+ years of dedicated service as Buildings & Grounds Committee Chair. He is stepping down from the committee and working to transition knowledge to new people. We are very grateful for all he has done to help keep our church and its grounds beautiful and well-maintained for all of us to enjoy. When you see Dick at church, please thank him for all his hard work! Thank you Dick!

His departure means we need NEW RECRUITS for the Buildings & Grounds Committee. Larissa Armstrong will serve as interim Chair to help keep track of work that needs to be done and to help onboard new committee members. Brad Bell has graciously agreed to take on some of the initial maintenance tasks, but can not do all this work alone! We need YOUR help! Are you good at general maintenance outdoor tasks like raking, mowing, snow shoveling? Interested in helping with some regular checks that you can do monthly or quarterly (depending) when you're at church on Sunday and check off the list (like changing the thermostats seasonally, changing room clocks when the time changes, checking the sump pump periodically)? Do you have good DIY repair skills when a little dry wall needs patched or a door handle breaks or we need some fresh paint? Ideally our committee will have 4-6 people on it, along with additional folks to help with seasonal lawn care and snow removal. This will ensure no one feels over-burdened by the task of building maintenance.

If you are interested in helping us, please contact Larissa at catch her at church on Sunday. If we can't find adequate help, that means we'll have to pay outside people to do the work, and our budget deficit will continue to increase.

The Board is almost finished revising our Policies and Procedures Manual, a task required of the Board every few years.

Exciting news: After discussions with the Director of the Bloomington-Normal Water Reclamation District (BNWRD), we received a free estimate from a plumbing group they are working with on a septic replacement program. After receiving the estimate to cap our septic tank and get hooked up to the sewer system (which will cost \$57,750 plus an additional \$34,500 to remove the sewage ejector in the basement and lower sewer invert to match the

sewer in the basement), BNWRD offered to cover the \$57,750 costs, waiving \$25,000 and letting UUBN pay off the remainder in yearly interest-free installments of \$1280 over 25 years to pay off the balance. The Board unanimously voted in favor of accepting this offer. We hope to raise the additional \$34,500 from the congregation to cover the sewage ejector removal (more on that later), and the next step is talking with our neighbors at St. John's to ensure they are okay with us making a bit of a mess along the property line between our churches. We are very excited about this generous offer from BNWRD and felt it was too good to pass up.

We will share more details about this at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 8th at 11:30am (complete agenda and supporting documents for the meeting were shared in a separate email). Paper copies are in the church ent If you have any questions please contact Larissa at

Y'all, I don't know about you, but I've heard a definite increase in complaining lately. I've noticed that when I'm complaining a lot, it's usually rooted in anxiety and not really about the topic of my complaint. There are a lot of reasons we complain. Complaining can be our reaction to change, stress, or uncertainty; complaining can be a way to seek validation. For some of us, complaining is how we ask for help finding a solution. For others, complaining is how we process information and it's really about "thinking out loud."

My young adult children learned long ago that when they complained to me about almost anything, I was going to respond with a suggested solution or try to guide them to a solution. That wasn't always what they wanted or needed. Now they will say, "I think I just need to talk this out with someone" OR "I really need help finding a solution." And if I complain to them, they'll ask me what I'm hoping to get out of the complaint.

INtegRIty Counseling is a community-based, non-profit counseling agency located in the heart of Bloomington's west side. INtegRIty enables a growing team of concerned professionals to partner in providing counseling, outreach, and community education on topics such as grief and loss, addiction, parenting, and coping skills for those with mental or emotional disorders. Their vision is "Stigma free mental health support for all." They serve all members of the community, regardless of race, gender, belief, orientation, or economic status. They do not have a set fee for counseling, but instead, use a "pay as you can" method and ask clients to contribute what they are able to afford for counseling.
